Review of Minutes & Staff Reports

- Previous Meeting Minutes—Minutes approved with no changes: 1st Skip Fromm; 2nd Danny Sprouse; Approval--unanimous
- Staff Report:

- Social Action—Chuck Martinson
 - o Another representative will attend beginning in 2020—Meghann Naveau
 - Planning a gathering highlighting all social action ministries between masses on Jan 26
 - Fair Trade sale at UD on Dec 7. St Francis representatives have a table for fair trade coffee and chocolate.

 - o Jacob has been very active and his involvement is greatly appreciated
 - Saturday morning CCD was cancelled due to only four registrants
 - o CCD grades 1-5 incudes 130 participants with 23 students for First Communion this year.
- Worship Commission (WC)—Jeannette Fromm
 - WC working on improving petitions

- WC started working on the Worship Assessment Tool, beginning with environment. Items noted include: scratches on the vessels requiring replating; doors are noisy which distracts from a quiet, prayerful setting; decorations appear to be a personal preference; discussion around lack of visibility of Tabernacle—located behind the wall; Fr. Brian stated we may investigate installing a window opening where the Tabernacle could be placed. It would have the back to the sanctuary and open into the chapel.. Anna voiced concerns about cleanliness of sanctuary and restrooms; location of additional rolls of toilet paper on back of toilet was questioned as it becomes contaminated resulting in waste of rolls.

 - o National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) –leaves 11/21; Keynote will be streamed live
 - o Students helped at Dayton Food Bank on Friday when school was not in session
 - Praise & Worship XLT will be Dec 8

• Action item review -- Anna Monnett

- Noted increase in handicap parking spots—response to question submitted to PAC
- Ask PAC—Jill—Beginning in January, we will hold Ask PAC on the weekend before PAC meeting. There will be no "Ask PAC" in December due to the holidays. Recent questions:
 - Playground area needed to support young families feeling welcome
 - Women's restroom—need 2 roll dispensers so toilet paper not on back of toilet
 - Need two songs at Offertory as it takes too long to gather the collection. Some churches do not bring the collection up, only the bread and wine.
- Hardscape Subcommittee—Deacon Chris stated the first meeting was extremely efficient.
 Cameron, will be presenting his Eagle Scout project to PAC in November.
- Presentation by Benjamin Cameron, prospective Eagle Scout project
 - Repair of the outside Stations of the Cross—refer to handout submitted
 - Bring the Stations closer to the parking lot for reflection from car for mobility impaired people
 - Decide on 6 ft or 9 ft crosses; material—cedar, composite or treated pine (current crosses are treated pine and approximately 25 yr old)
 - Use small gravel / sand mix to set into ground vs concrete for ease of removal / care
 - Cost of supplies: Gravel \$433; Pine 6 ft crosses \$190; Pine 9 ft crosses \$360; Cedar and composite not costed out. Deacon Chris will continue to work with Benjamin on this project. PAC expressed preference for 9 ft wooden crosses and interested in cost out for cedar.
 - o Anna expressed our appreciation for Benjamin's plan and presentation
