Miracles of the Eucharist are miraculous divine interventions that are aimed at confirming faith in the real presence of the body and blood of the Lord in the Eucharist.

With the Words of Consecration, "this is my body" and "this is my blood," the substance of the bread becomes the body of Christ and the substance of the wine becomes his blood.

Only the appearances of bread and wine remain, but the true reality has become the body and blood of Christ.

#### Miracle of Tixtla, Mexico



On October 21, 2006 Father Leopoldo Roque, pastor of the Parish of Saint Martin of Tours, another priest and a religious sister were distributing Communion.

The sister turns towards him with the "pix" containing the Sacred Particles, looking at Father with eyes filled with tears, an incident that immediately attracted the attention of the celebrant: the Host that she had taken to give Communion to a parishioner had begun to effuse a reddish substance.

Scientific research was conducted between October 2009 and October 2012.

By analyzing the Host it was observed that it was human blood of type AB and that it corresponded to tissue. Then an analysis was done which confirmed that it was live cardiac muscle.

## Miracle of Bordeaux, France

This Eucharistic Miracle occurred in 1821 in the Church of St. Eulalia in Rue Mazarin, Bordeaux.

Jesus appeared in the Host immediately after Abbot Delort gave the benediction with the Blessed Sacrament. The great number of faithful present were able to contemplate

– for more than twenty minutes – the apparition of the Blessing Jesus, imprinted on the Host exposed for public adoration



### Miracle of Rome, Italy



On the altar steps of the Caetani Chapel of Santa Pudenziana Church in Rome, to this day there is the imprint and the stain of Blood left by a Host which fell from the hands of a priest while celebrating the Mass in 1610.

The man was overtaken by doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus in consecrated Host, and immediately after the consecration, he inadvertently let the Host fall to the ground, where the imprinted mark is still visible today.
